












Accreditation is...
























Accreditation Characteristics:

- Each accrediting agency sets its own standards in conjunction with its members
- Standards are developed and institutions are assessed in a peer review process
- Program objectives are set by the institution
- Self-evaluation is the foundation for assessment
- Institutional success is measured by the success of meeting institutional objectives
- Continuous improvement











Accreditation Outcomes:

- Verify that an institution or program meets established standards
- Involve the faculty and staff comprehensively in institutional evaluation and planning
- Assist prospective students in identifying acceptable institutions
- Establish criteria for professional certification, licensure and upgrading courses
- Help to identify institutions and programs for the investment of public and private funds
- Help determine eligibility for Federal assistance





Equity and Quality

Institutions track data on persistence, graduation, high-impact practices (HIPs), and learning outcomes; many fewer disaggregate data on HIPs and learning outcomes.



Student Learning Outcomes

Emphasis on integration of knowledge, skills, and application than on broad knowledge acquisition.

Desirable Outcomes:


